HIGHLIGHTS

Employers must post their OSHA 300A for the 2021 calendar year by Feb. 1. 2023.

The form must remain on display until April 30.

Employers subject to OSHA's electronic reporting requirement will need to submit information from their OSHA 300A form by March 2.

Annual summaries must be posted in each establishment in a conspicuous place or places where notices are customarily posted.

LEGAL UPDATES

OSHA FORM 300A POSTING REQUIREMENTS FOR FEBRUARY 1ST

The Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) requires that employers subject to its recordkeeping requirements post copies of their OSHA Form 300A between February 1 and April 30 of each year.

The OSHA Form 300A, also known as the "Summary of Work-related Injuries and Illnesses," must be completed by Feb. 1 using data from the previous calendar year.

OSHA's record-keeping requirement does not apply to employers with 10 or fewer employees, or to employers that are in a partially exempt industry.

Severe Injury Reporting

Employers must report any worker fatality within eight hours and any amputation, loss of an eye or hospitalization of a worker within 24 hours.

Employer Action Steps

On Feb. 1, employers subject to OSHA recordkeeping requirements must ensure that copies of their completed Forms 300A are posted in each of their establishments. The form must be displayed in a conspicuous place or places where notices to employees are customarily posted.

Until April 30, these employers must also ensure that their Form 300A postings remain in place and are not altered, defaced or covered by other material.

TOP 10 2022 CITED STANDARDS

The Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) keeps records for the **most frequently cited standards** following inspections of worksites for each fiscal year. The 2022 fiscal year ran from Oct. 1, 2021 through Sept. 30, 2022.

OSHA provided this list to inform employers of the most commonly cited standards in the workplace, thus **helping them focus on hazard recognition and prevention strategies**. The most recent statistics from OSHA reveal the top 10 standards cited in fiscal year 2022 and the total number of violations for each standard.











Respiratory protection (1910.134): 2,185 violations



Fall Protection-Training Requirements (1926.503): 1,556 violations



Ladders (1926.105): 2,143 violations



Personal Protective & Life-saving Equipment-Eye & Face Protection (1926.102): 1,401 violations



Scaffolding (1926.451): 2,058 violations



Machine Guarding (1910.212): 1,370 violations
